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## Mission

The mission of the Emergency Medicine Residency Program at NMCS D is to prepare physicians for a lifelong practice in emergency medicine and to support the Navy & Marine Corps expeditionary, humanitarian, and combat missions. The program strives to develop Navy Emergency Medicine physicians with the knowledge, skills, behaviors and learning strategies to provide competent emergency care to our active duty members, their children and spouses, as well as, veterans, retirees, and foreign military partners across a wide-variety of clinical settings and austere operational environments. Additionally, the program strives to develop Navy Emergency Medicine physicians with the administrative and leadership skills to serve as the next generation of leaders within the Navy, Department of Defense and civilian Emergency Medicine communities.

## Aims

- The program aims to develop highly-competent Emergency Medicine physicians who possess the knowledge, skills, behaviors, and life-long learning strategies required to competently and confidently recognize, resuscitate, stabilize, and appropriately disposition acutely ill or injured patients while adhering to principals of symptom relief, resource allocation and customer service.
- The program aims to develop Navy Emergency Medicine physicians into expeditionary care providers capable of successfully adapting their knowledge and skills in emergency medicine across a wide-variety of clinical settings and austere operational environments.





## Academic Curriculum

The academic curriculum is the structural plan for the residency and is based on the ACGME Emergency Medicine Residency Program requirements. The main elements of the curriculum include:

- (1) Weekly academic conferences (MK),
- (2) Clinical block rotations (PC, MK, SBP),
- (3) Procedural laboratories (Vivarium, Cadaver, and Procedural Workshop) (PC),
- (4) Journal club (MK, PBL),
- (5) Longitudinal Ultrasound curriculum (PC, MK)
- (6) Supplemental planned educational activities

REBIL (MK, PBL)  
PS/QI (PBL, SBP),  
Administration (SBP),  
Research (PBL),  
Operational Medicine (OPMED) (MK, SBP),  
Military Professional Development (PROF)
